

# **LUDWIGSBURG FAVORITE PALACE**

The Baroque Ludwigsburg Favorite Palace (Schloss Favorite) served Duke Eberhard Ludwig as a pleasure palace and hunting lodge, and houses a completely preserved interior in the Classical style.

Located directly north of Ludwigsburg Residential Palace, Favorite Palace enjoys a commanding position overlooking an extensive park, whose woodlands were originally planted for a pheasantry.

## **HUNTING LODGE, SUMMER RESIDENCE, WEDDING VENUE**

Favorite Palace was constructed between 1717 and 1723 on behalf of Duke Eberhard Ludwig and to the designs of the court architect Donato Giuseppe Frisoni. Not intended as a permanent residence, the palace primarily served as an eye-catching structure to complete Ludwigsburg's main axis in the north. The Baroque palace was otherwise used for hunts and as a summer villa. The bel étage offered an excellent view. In 1748, the palace provided the perfect backdrop for a spectacular fireworks display at the wedding of Duke Carl Eugen and Elisabeth Friederike of Brandenburg-Bayreuth.

Carl Eugen was also the one who relocated the pheasantry and introduced white stags to the park. Duke Friedrich II, who became Württemberg's first king in 1806, converted the park into a zoo-with fallow deer, chamois, and spotted deer-soon after coming to power.





# **ORIGINAL CLASSICAL INTERIORS**

In the early 19th century, the duke and subsequent king, Friedrich I von Württemberg, had architect Nikolaus von Thouret redesign and furnish Favorite's interior in the Classical style. The rooms were decorated with elaborate stucco embellishments and paintings. The Classic interior remains to this day, apart from one room that still reflects the Baroque style of Duke Eberhard Ludwig. For most of the 20th century, the palace was neglected, falling into disrepair. Then, between 1972 and 1982, the palace was thoroughly restored to its former glory.
