In collaboration with the German Commission for UNESCO and the World Heritage Coordination Office at the Federal Foreign Office, the State Palaces and Gardens of Baden-Württemberg will be hosting a digital round table to mark the 30th UNESCO anniversary of Maulbronn Monastery entitled "30 Years of World Heritage: Successes and Challenges around the Globe" on Thursday, March 7, from 12:00 PM to 2:00 PM Central European Time: At the event, Maulbronn Monastery will exchange ideas with other World Heritage sites that were also added to the World Heritage List in 1993 or 1994 – such as the old town of Bamberg, the historic center of Vilnius and the whale sanctuary of El Vizcaino Mexico.
